The pandemic really changed the blood supply and its stability. Donations at high schools and colleges were severely impacted by COVID, with donations from those under 24 dropping roughly 40% from 2019 to 2021. There has been a 56% growth in donors over the age of 70. Those donors won't be able to give for much longer.

The Blood Connection is committed to being a resource to educators and students regarding blood donation content. As the needs of the region's education and healthcare system have evolved – so has our school programming. PARTNERSHIP Commitment

Required

In-school blood drives: minimum of **2 blood drives** per school year *(preferred 3 or more)* ran by Student/Staff.

Recommended

PARTNERSHIP Commitment

TBC INVESTMENT *Per School*

ADDITIONAL OFFERINGS available to partner schools:

*Select as many offerings as you would like implemented at your school

Participation in and access to live webinars (recordings also available) – 4 per year

TOPICS TO INCLUDE: Advocacy/Legislation, Marketing/PR, blood in the body, blood component processing, donor and recipient stories.

Access to NGSS aligned modules, lesson plans and curriculum, and activities — focused on blood donation

RELEVANT AUDIENCE: Bio/AP, Bio/Anatomy/Health/HOSA

School personnel point of contact for blood drives will receive a \$500 or \$1,000 stipend depending on how many blood drives are hosted (should be a teacher or staff member who *engages students and colleagues in a meaningful way*).

\$500 for hosting 2 blood drives

This contact will be responsible for leading and executing selected offerings. Additionally, this contact will be an advocate within the school, leading efforts to increase TBC awareness and connections in the school community. Stipends will be paid out in November and May.

\$1000 for hosting 3 or more drives

TBC in-person or virtual presentation – overview of The Blood Connection as an organization, career opportunities and blood drive leadership training

RELEVANT AUDIENCE: Health, Sociology, Biology/Science classes, HOSA groups, student service groups supporting blood drives/awareness tables

TBC Facility Tour (ONLY for schools hosting 3+ drives) – a behind the scenes look at service lines and career opportunities (available in certain regions because of proximity to HQ) + \$500 GRANT

awarded to school for each blood drive collecting more than 30 blood donations.



RELEVANT AUDIENCE: Any student group interested in career exploration

BENEFITS TO *The School*

TBC SWAG

Promotional items such as **T-shirts will be provided** by TBC for blood donors at school drives.

HOSA INVOLVEMENT

Additional resources focused on **job/career readiness** and **potential tours**.

GRANTS/STIPENDS

Grants/stipends are issued to schools who collect **more than 30** blood donations at each drive.

BENEFITS TO Students

RED CORD PROGRAM

Any student who donates 3 or more times with TBC (whether at the school or elsewhere) receives a red honor cord to wear at graduation.

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

For students who host **OFF–SITE blood drives** when school is not in session (winter & summer breaks).

Up to a \$500 scholarship given to university/continuing education organization (*not just if attending college*) per blood drive (*minimum total blood donations requirement must be fulfilled*).
